Description of Special Awards Program

The Special Awards Program is a vital component of the State Science and Engineering Fair commitment to scientific research and inspire young people by giving them confidence in their abilities and encouraging their study of science. This program offers a unique opportunity for organizations to support and encourage achievements by young people in STEM — science, technology, engineering, and math.

The Awards Program depends on the generosity of Donors. Donors include individuals at the local, state, and national levels from businesses, industry, institutions, government agencies, and scientific professional organizations.

Donation Process

To donate Special Awards, Scholarships, and/or Internship Opportunity Awards, simply complete the appropriate form provided on our website (www.ssefflorida.com) and send to FFFS, PO Box 67, Goldenrod, FL 32733 by December 15th for inclusion on the website and program book. The actual award(s) must be received NO LATER than January 15th.

It is important for Donors to **give detailed specifications for each Award**, such as whether it should be designated for a project in the Senior Section (Grades 9-12), or the Junior Section (Grades 6-8). Donors are also asked to specify whether their award should go to a student whose project is in a particular Category or subject area. Detailed information on the various Categories is enclosed.

Donors may provide Judges to interview and select the Finalists who will receive their organization's awards.

Donors may request that their award be used wherever needed (FFFS discretionary). This allows the FFFS to maintain a balance of awards in each Category. Please note: Awards cannot be restricted to a project from a particular Regional Science and Engineering Fair.

Types of Awards

<u>SPECIAL AWARDS</u> These awards are cash awards, plaques, science related gifts, grants, and much more provided by organizations. The organization provides the specific research criteria for their award(s) and Judges to interview Finalists for the award. Keep in mind that students have already competed at two other levels before being selected for the SSEF competition so the award should reflect their commitment to science research at a higher level of competition. Awards should recognize both dedication and excellence in STEM research.

SCHOLARSHIP NOMINATION AWARD The participating college/university provides a specific description of the scholarship nomination offerings. Interested students complete a generic SSEF Scholarship Application and provide teacher reference letters if interested in the scholarship offering. The college/university may choose to provide Judge(s) to interview students for the scholarship offering(s) or the SSEF Awards Committee will select the students to be nominated. The application documents are provided to the college/university for final determination for awarding the scholarship.

<u>OPPORTUNITY/INTERNSHIP AWARDS</u> Summer employment and internship awards are listed as opportunity/internship awards. The student must complete an application specific to the organization's offering. The organization provides Judge(s) to review the applications and interview the applicants to select the winners for the award.
